WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT YOUNG CHILDREN

- Some do not have a strong sense of urgency that it is "time to go"
- They don't always like to stop what they are doing
- It is easy for them to forget the consequences of delay
- Many only use a potty chair in a familiar setting
- All sometimes need help, especially during the first weeks of school
- Accidents happen

BUILDING INDEPENDENCE

On their own, can your child...

- Unbuckle, unsnap, pull down pants, or lift dress to get on the toilet?
- Get toilet paper and wipe themselves?
- Flush the toilet?
- Redo clothing when they are done?
- Wash hands with soap, and dry hands with towel, after every use?

TOILETING AT SCHOOL

- Students are expected to be able to independently undo/redo clothing and properly clean themselves
- School staff work with students to achieve successful and independent toileting, but do not "potty train"
- Children are not required to be fully toilet trained to attend NNPS Preschool
- Families will be notified if child is having difficulty in this area
- Each child needs a full change of clothing, to be kept at school, and updated seasonally
- Open communication between home and school is essential for your child's success





PRACTICE AT HOME

- Schedule more opportunities to "go"
- Follow a consistent routine
- Model proper bathroom skills
- Encourage your child to use the real

toilet, not a potty chair

- Monitor your child's bathroom use
- Encourage independence
- Praise success
- Avoid punishing mistakes or accidents
